## SCIENTIFIC ACTIVITIES

### Most important research activities and financed projects

2018-2021 RECONNECT, H2020 Societal Challenges, financed project, team coordinator WP Rule of law. RECONNECT views democracy and rule of law as inseparable and intertwined. The quality of democracy cannot be evaluated without considering the rule of law and vice versa. Conversely, democracy and the rule of law can no longer act as legitimising forces if they are not conducive to solidarity and justice, especially in times of contestation of European authority and legitimacy. While authority can be defined as the delegated competence to exercise sovereign power, legitimacy refers to the morally justified exercise of power. The project is implemented by a consortium of 17 academic partners and it is led by the Center for Global Governance of Leuven.

2018-2019 EMOJI (Explicabilité des Modèles prédictifs dans le domaine Juridique) funded by CNRS INS2I, scheme «PEPS S2IH (Sciences de l'Information en Interaction avec l'Humain). This project focuses on predictive models used in the context of human decision-making processes. Whether it be in theoretical researches or practical applications, today's approaches don't take into account the need for interpretability of the decisions issued by those models. The project intends to tackle this issue by using recent technics proposed to incorporate interpretability and accountability properties, by considering different judicial contexts.

2017-18 *Beyond the "Etat de droit"*, international project financed by the INSTITUT D'ETUDES AVANCÉES PARIS. The project explicitly focuses on the quality of justice as a concept that encompasses the rule of law and other important dimensions of a just society and a good democracy. It calls for a shift in the focus of both scientific research and policy discourse. Rather than focusing exclusively and predominantly on the formal design of the legal and judicial institutions, the novelty of the project consists of casting light on the "law and justice phenomenon" first and foremost from a multi-dimensional point of view, which covers both the demand and the offer of the "law" and of "justice". The relationship between law-driven conflict management mechanisms and the ideal of justice emerges as a complex and compound one. It is not simply a matter of extra judicial or alternative dispute settlement mechanisms, it is also a matter of what the law is expected to contribute to a society, from the point of view of its members, the citizens. It will consider the European member States, as first sample, in the quantitative analysis. Then it will focus on two national cases, selected on the basis of the similarities that the formal design of their ordinary courts system feature, notably Italy and France. As a third and very important step, it will consider the level of social groups and communities within four urban contexts (Paris, Milan, Marseille, Catania), with the in-depth study of their "law and justice" expectations and notions.

2017 *Anti terrorism laws and fundamental rights*, project co-coordinated under the auspices of the SOCIÉTÉ DE LÉGISLATION COMPARÉE, SECTION DROIT PUBLICQUE, focusing on 10 countries. The goal of the project is to investigate and highlight convergent/divergent

- patterns of balance between the enforcement of the individual freedoms (notably freedom of mobility, economic freedom, and freedom of speech are considered) and the pursuit of security and public order objectives. The data are collected relying on the case laws of 10 countries and the correspondent legislative debates unfolded after 2001.
- 2017 *Leadership and Judicial Governance* (The organisational cohesiveness and the mechanisms of professional accountability in the European courts), project financed by the EUROPEAN NETWORK FOR JUDICIAL TRAINING, under the supervision of the Methodology Standing Group. The project considers 5 countries, featuring either a professional or a bureaucratic pattern of judicial governance. The project is conducted as principal investigator and will be finalised in December 2017.

Focus groups and structured interviews have been conducted and are going to be conducted in about 15 judicial offices.

Project led by the SALZBURG CENTRE FOR EUROPEAN STUDIES (scientific coordinator Sonia Rielmann). “The project aims to study the preferences of member states’ governments’ for different models of a fiscal union. The theoretical framework builds on the comparative political economy literature and liberal intergovernmentalism and argues that domestic economic, fiscal and political factors explain member states’ preferences. Individual focus on the Southern EU cabinet decision making processes.
- 2014 *Valeurs et innovation dans la justice*, project financed by the FRENCH MINISTRY OF JUSTICE. MISSION DROIT ET JUSTICE. This project is framed into a broader research agenda carried on jointly with the Institut des Hautes Etudes sur la Justice, having as key focus the interactions between technological innovations and post bureaucratic organisational settings, specially in court systems. The project aimed to investigate the extent to which the technological innovations are conducive of new mentalities and new behavioral patterns in the courts as well as in the bar councils.

The project aimed to answer without endorsing a normative vision of a good democracy, rather starting from an empirical analysis, how democracies have reached to the 2007-08 economic crisis. Furthermore, the methodology



uses the qualitative analysis as a way to deepen and integrate the quantitative analysis and, thereby, it innovates the current scholarship on this topic. The project has created a dataset which allows the teams involved into it to permanently work in partnership with the international scientific community. The countries analysed from a qualitative point of view have been France, Germany, Italy, Poland, Spain, and United Kingdom.

2011-14 *Menu for Justice*, scientific co-coordinator (together with Carlo Guarnieri) and responsible for the dissemination work-package. PROJECT FINANCED under the LIFELONG LEARNING PROGRAMME OF THE EUROPEAN UNION (DG EDUCATION AND CULTURE) and has been realized as a joint research and education support program by a consortium of 48 universities, whose leading partner was the University of Bologna. The project has been path breaking in many respects. It has collected Europe wide data on the legal education and the judicial training programs. The DG Justice of the European Commission has referring to it to launch a consultation round on the competences and the functional needs of the courts (carried on within the frame of the EIPA project on judicial training). It has strengthened a wide network of collaborations both in the academic and in the judicial institutions. Finally this project has inspired the design and the implementation of the first program of judicial training offered by the Italian justice system to senior magistrates.

2011 *Dialogue among High Courts*, member of the international team, project financed by the Hague Institute for the Internationalization of Law (scientific coordinators Sam Muller, HIIL, Ton Hol, Utrecht University, and Andrea Lollini, University of Bologna). The project touched a wide spreading phenomenon, i.e. the increasing “dialogue” carried on by courts across domestic borders. Horizontal mechanisms of coordination, such as dialogue, especially in the European Union, have been extensively investigated. Contributors have been observing both the macro and micro levels, collecting and analysing data on the appointment mechanisms of supreme courts justices, on the cultural preconditions and the strategic determinants of the dialogue (quest for external legitimacy), on the convergent orientations of the courts.

2009-12 *The quality of democracy in Europe*, co-coordinator and co-manager (together with Leonardo Morlin), project financed by the ITALIAN MINISTRY OF UNIVERSITY AND RESEARCH (PRIN-COFIN programme). The research project aimed at designing an analytical grid to assess the quality of a democracy. The grid encompassed 8 dimensions: rule of law, electoral accountability, inter-institutional accountability, participation, competition, responsiveness, freedom, equality/solidarity. Hypothesis and methodologies have been inspired by the on going international debate on democratic quality. The project has taken into consideration France, Germany, Italy, Spain, and United Kingdom. The project has paved the way toward new research activities, such as the case study on the Italian justice system, the comparative analysis of the Southern European democracies, and a worldwide network of scholars the majority of which are members of the IPSA RC34 Quality of Democracy).

2008 *Due Process of Law. EU/US in comparative perspective*, individual project, financed by the Fulbright Commission and hosted by the Boalt Hall School of Law University of Berkeley.

The goal of the project was to understand, in comparative terms, the 1) model of constitutionalism embedded into the EU/US political systems and 2) assess the potential impact that these two models may have if exported in the developing countries by means of the democracy and the rule of law programs. This project, if considered together with the project “*The Constitutionalization of the EU*”, represented a step forward in the direction of an empirical notion of rule of law, such as the one elaborated into the “rule of law” item I authored for the International Encyclopedia of Political Science.

2003-04 *The Constitutionalization of the EU*, individual project financed by the EUROPEAN COMMISSION, JEAN MONNET ACTION, JEAN MONNET FELLOWSHIP. This project, hosted by the EUROPEAN UNIVERSITY INSTITUTE, was an attempt to apply the conceptual and the methodological tools developed in comparative politics to the “constitutionalism”, a subject largely studied by legal scholars. The research has been developed by emphasizing two different aspects: the model of constitutional democracy promoted by the EU in the enlargement process and the models of constitutionalism embedded into the CEECs institutions, especially into the constitutional courts. The potential tension created between the EU constitutionalism and the constitutionalism inherited from the past tradition in each CEEC has represented the core issue of the entire research.
